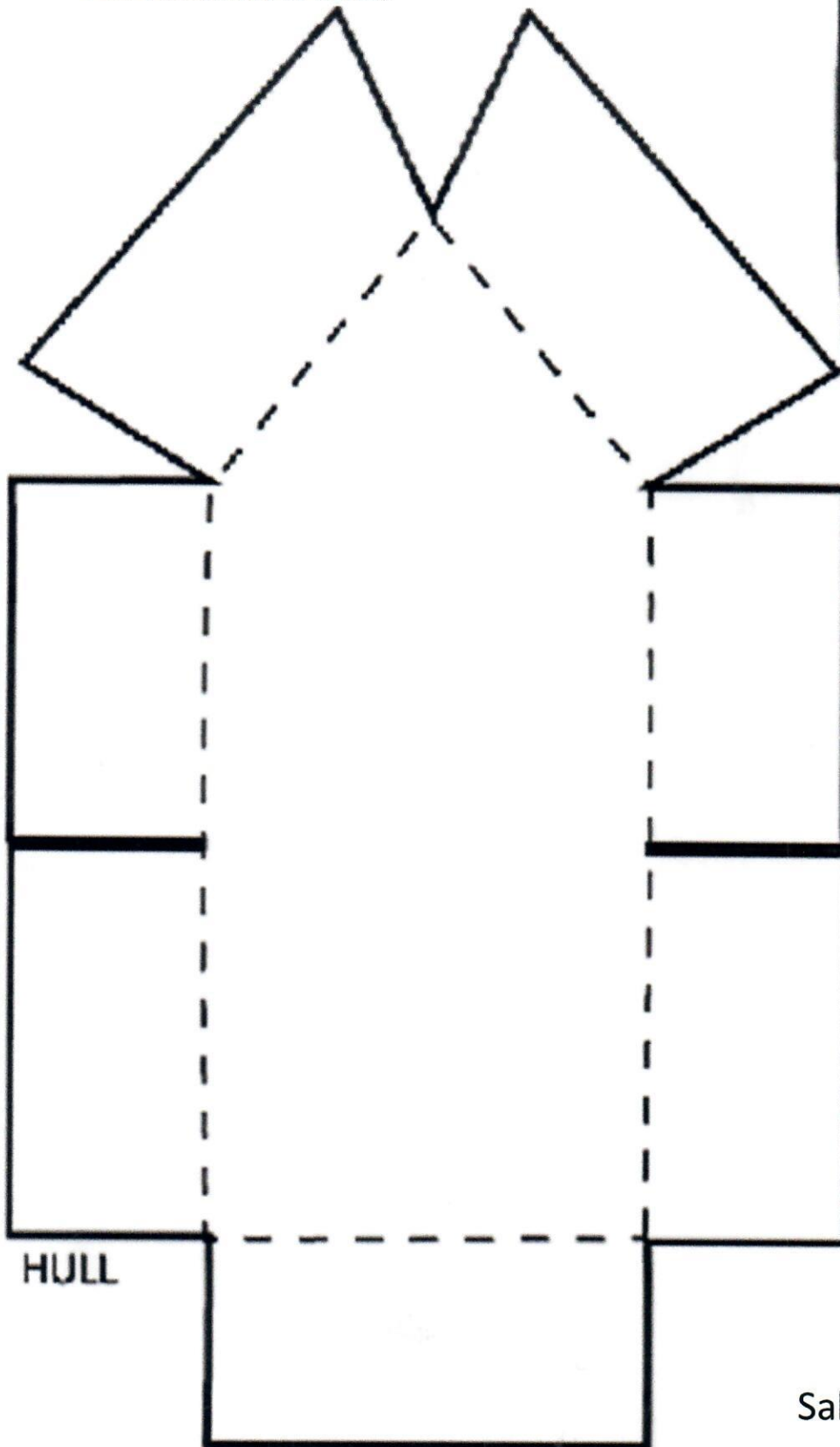

CHALLENGE 1 (FROM YOUR LOG SHEET)

1. Decorate the ship's hull and sail with crayons. If you rub a lot of crayon wax on the bottom and sides of the hull, the ship could float in water.



2. Cut out the hull and fold up along the dotted lines. Use tape to connect the flaps together.
3. Cut out the sail. With a hole punch, punch a hole in the top and bottom of the sail. Slide a straw through the holes.
4. Attach the bottom of the straw to the inside of the hull with glue, tape, or Model Magic.

Use different designs on your sail to display what kind of ship it is. Use the designs below to give you an idea.

Pirates draw skull and cross bones on their sails.

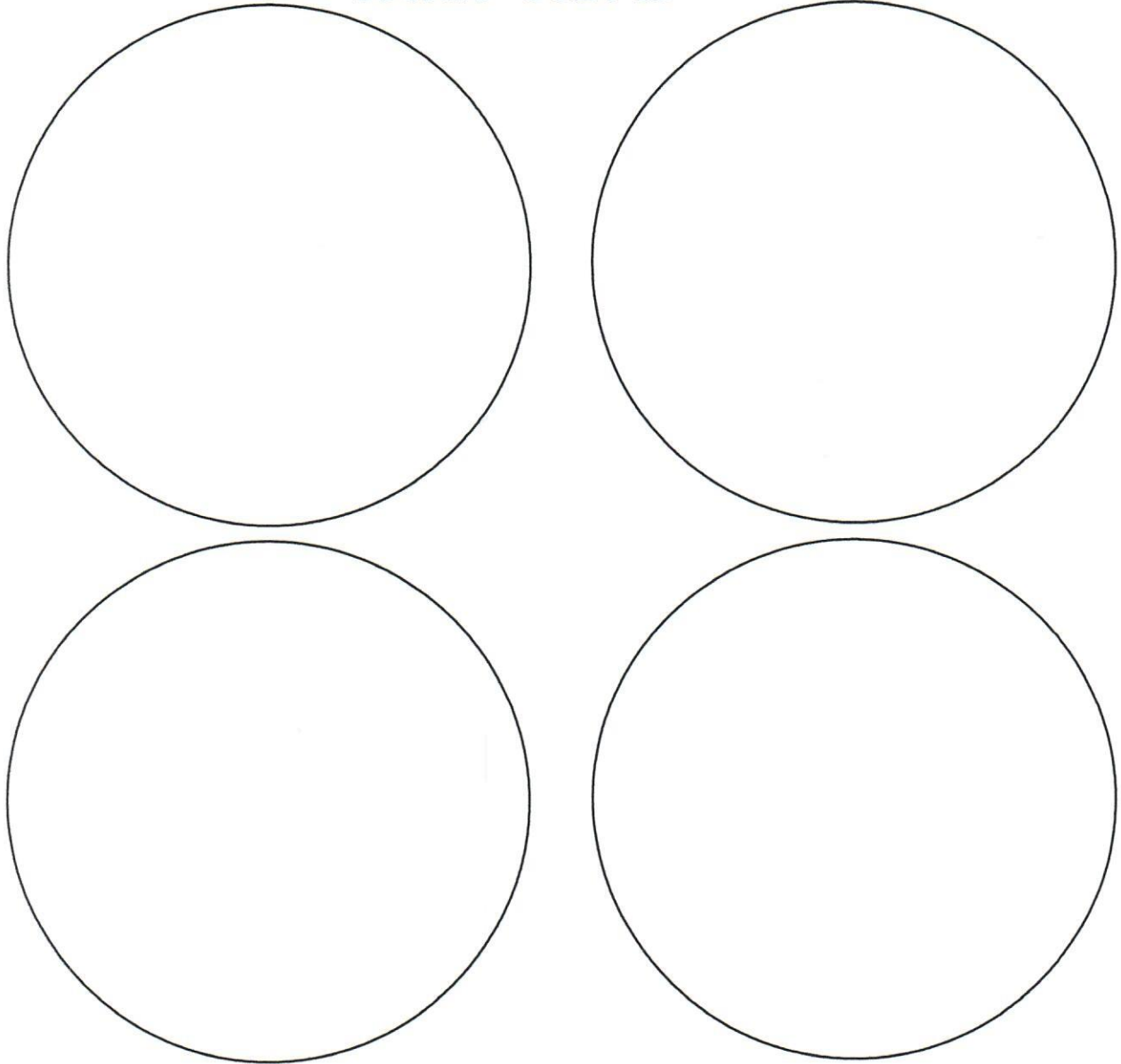
CHALLENGE 2
